WHAT A YEAR

2024/25 has been one of the busiest and most transformative years we've ever known at BACKUP. Time seems to move faster than ever, and as an organisation we've been stretched, tested, and—most importantly—continued to change.

The greatest challenge has been staffing and recruitment. Not long ago, advertising a support worker role meant sifting through 30 applications. Those days are gone, and like so many across housing and social care, we've had to adapt. Adapt we have. We've welcomed brilliant new colleagues, celebrated internal promotions—including support workers stepping into management and a manager moving into our senior leadership team—and our proudest recruitment moment of all: welcoming back an ex-resident as part of our workforce.

What hasn't changed is our unwavering commitment: delivering high-quality services with and for young people, achieving powerful outcomes, and making a lasting impact in the Bolton community. The numbers and social value speak volumes, but what moves us most are the stories—the lives changed, and in some cases, saved. They continue to inspire us to push harder, aim higher, and do better.



This year's standout achievement was BACKUP becoming Ofsted registered in August 2024—a milestone made possible through the dedication and leadership of our COO, Paulette Campbell and the support of the Service Managers within the Supported Housing Service.

It really reflects the collective effort of our incredible, tenacious, and passionate team, united in their determination to ensure young people in our care start well, live well, and age well, in line with the Bolton Plan 2025–2028.

We're also proud to have become ambassadors for the Bolton Place Brand, flying the flag for our hometown with its bold mantra: Bolton is born to perform. It couldn't suit us better. Since 1992, BACKUP has been performing at the highest levels—delivering supported, emergency, and temporary housing for young people in crisis. And we're far from finished.

THE CHALLENGE -

Youth homelessness remains a complex and pressing issue in Bolton and Greater Manchester. Alongside housing insecurity, many young people face trauma, poor mental health, and a lack of opportunities.

Living without a safe and stable environment has a drastic impact on health, education and future prospects.

STATISTICS



An estimated 136,000 young people aged 16-24 were homeless or at risk of homelessness in the UK in 2022/23, with the true figure being hard to measure. Homelessness, and particularly youth homelessness, is underreported. (*Action for Children)

Between the ages of 16-24, homeless young people are at least twice as likely to die as their housed contemporaries. By the time they get to the 25-34 age bracket they are four times more likely to die. (*Crisis)

1 in 62 young people in the UK will become homeless. (*Centrepoint 2024)

UNFLINCHING ARMS - OUR RESPONSE

Young people facing homelessness and multiple disadvantages are among the most vulnerable in society. Without timely intervention, their entire future is at risk.

They need more than a place to live—they need consistent, compassionate human support. While our services are accommodation-based, there is a vast difference between having a roof overhead and having a safe, stable environment where growth is possible.

WE SUPPORT YOUNG PEOPLE AGED 16-25 WHO ARE HOMELESS, INCLUDING YOUNG PARENTS AND THOSE EXPECTING A CHILD.

OUR SERVICES INCLUDE EMERGENCY AND TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION, HOLISTIC WRAPAROUND SUPPORT, ADVICE, AND GUIDANCE.

VOICE OF YOUNG PEOPLE

"R" SHARES HER EXPERIENCE:

"When I was 17, I was at BACKUP. At 18, I got a job at Haven, but I needed a uniform—fast. BACKUP bought everything I needed. I made it to work, but when the season ended, I was still homeless and ended up couch-surfing.

I REMEMBERED THEY SAID: 'IF YOU EVER GET STUCK, CALL US.' I WAS EMBARRASSED, BUT I CALLED—AND THEY LET ME COME BACK. THAT'S WHAT A HOME IS."

IN AN EMERGENCY, WE BEND OUR OWN RULES.

Our residents come to us through a referrals process, and we are unable to accommodate every referral – no matter how much we wish to. In 2024 we were not only full but running a lengthy waiting list. However, when a young woman was raped while sleeping rough this year, our team broke protocol, searched the streets at night, and brought her to safety



WE SHOW UP.

"I was having some problems with substance abuse. I had a meeting to go to, my support worker went with me. She made it possible, going with me and then having that debrief after, no judgement - it's a commitment above and beyond. I can't place the feeling - I felt supported, I don't think I would have gone if I had to go alone."

SUPPORT IS PERSONAL

A young mother, anxious about not being able to read food or medicine labels for her baby, was taught to read by one of our team.

Her support worker called in whilst off sick to continue the lessons virtually.

WE'LL ENGAGE WITH THEIR INTERESTS.

Two struggling residents invited their support worker to a gaming shop, where they introduced her to the world of gaming! They opened up to her on the drive back - an opportunity for connection they wouldn't otherwise have had.

OUR ACCOMMODATION FEELS LIKE HOME.

We won't put any young person somewhere we wouldn't live ourselves. That means it's not just safe, but comfortable, well-appointed and full of welcoming touches that say 'you matter and we care about you.'

Statistics are useful for measuring the scale of the problems and the growth of our strategy to solve them. What numbers don't show us is the humanity: the real young people who have been through so much and the depth of feeling of the staff who support them.

We believe that success isn't always measured in big milestones. We celebrate first steps: using a microwave, paying for groceries, walking into a café, speaking up in a group. These are signs of shifting out of survival mode and starting to thrive.



FOR OUR TEAM, IT'S OFTEN IN THE SMALL EVENTS AND INTERACTIONS THAT MAKE YOUR HEART SURGE, MAKE YOU THINK "THIS IS WHAT I'M HERE FOR".

WHAT GIVES YOU CHILLS? WHAT MAKES YOU LIGHT UP... OR FILL UP? WE CALL THEM SPARKLING MOMENTS...

WHY IT MATTERS: THESE ARE NOT JUST MOMENTS. THEY'RE PROOF - THAT HEALING IS HAPPENING, THAT CONNECTION IS POSSIBLE

- A young man rediscovered friendship after losing his sight.
- A new resident learnt to use a kettle for the first time.
- A single mum went to college after years of fear and doubt.
- Residents wrote anonymous positive notes for each other and put them around their flats.
- A young man who had been trafficked to work on a cannabis farm saw a beautiful side to the UK and tested his own strength by completing the Three Peaks Challenge.
- A young woman who had once been withdrawn and avoided eye contact modelled in a fashion show.

- Mums and babies went to Smithills Farm, shared gifts and made memories.
- A young parent learnt to read for the first time through lessons with her support worker.
- A delegation of young people visited the Houses of Parliament to share what they had been through.
- A spontaneous trip to a gaming shop created an opportunity for honesty and connection.
- A young person got their first ever birthday cake and its design featured all their favourite things.

FINANCE

FINANCES AT BACKUP ARE ALWAYS A CAREFUL BALANCING ACT. WITH FIERCE COMPETITION FOR FUNDING, FEWER GRANT OPPORTUNITIES, AND A CONSTANTLY SHIFTING COMMISSIONING LANDSCAPE, WE HAVE TO STAY BUSINESS-SAVVY, PERSISTENT, AND CREATIVE TO KEEP OUR SERVICES STRONG.

This year, support from funders including **Children in Need** and **Provincial Walsh** has been invaluable. We've used their grants as leverage to unlock further funding, helping us to stretch every pound and amplify its impact. That's why the income we generate through our **fundraising events**, **Charlie the Van**, and our Guardians scheme is more important than ever. Unlike restricted grants, this income gives us the flexibility to focus on what matters most: **young people**.

WE'VE SET AN AMBITIOUS GOAL FOR 2025/26: 100 GUARDIANS.

Reaching this milestone would provide more than **5,000 hours of direct support each year,** enabling us to step in during moments of acute mental health crisis—where self-harm and thoughts of suicide are sadly all too common.

BEHIND THE SCENES, OUR TEAM HAS DEDICATED 536 HOURS THIS YEAR TO WRITING BIDS, FUNDING APPLICATIONS, BUSINESS CASES, AND TENDERS.
