CHAIRS FOREWORD

CHAIR'S FOREWORD

DR STEVE SHARPLES

This is a very important year for BACKUP NW. It is the year of our 30th Anniversary. For the last 30 years, first as the Bolton Young Persons Housing Scheme and now as BACKUP NW, we have been providing housing and support for young people aged 16-25 across Bolton.

In that time the number of young people we are able to support at any one time has risen from low double figures to over 100. We have been able to do that by opening new projects and support systems as our financial resources grew and our staff team expanded and became even more skilled. So we now have a wide variety of projects, all of which offer accommodation and support to young people of varying needs and in different ways, such as Project Front Door, the Lucas Project, Redds Place, Loft House, our supported lodgings project, and so on. These are major developments of the original vision for what has become BACKUP. But it is thanks to the commitment and hard work of the original staff team and Boards that the BACKUP of today has been able to move forward in the way that it has.

Although much in UK society has changed in the last 30

years what has not changed, sadly, is the need for projects such as BACKUP. Indeed, the problem of homelessness, and especially homelessness amongst young people, is an ever greater problem than it was back then. So homelessness amongst young people has become even more intertwined with issues around mental health, drug use and abuse, sexual exploitation, and family breakdown. Here at BACKUP we are constantly having to deal with the consequences of those major social problems.

BACKUP's ability to respond to those changing needs over 30 years has been down to the quality of its staff team. For more than ten years now that team has been led by Maura Jackson. Her energy, clarity of vision, grasp of detail of what 'support' means, and astonishing ability to raise the money we need to continually develop the organization, is legendary in the community and voluntary sector in the North West. We also now have the best organizational structure we have ever had to keep BACKUP delivering what it needs to do for Bolton.

Finally, I also want to acknowledge here the contribution of my colleagues on the BACKUP Board over the years I have been privileged to be its Chair. It is our job as Trustees to ensure our staff team, under Maura's leadership, have what they need to keep BACKUP at the leading edge of service delivery in Bolton. I am delighted that my fellow Trustees have been able to do that I know this will continue as BACKUP moves in to its next 30 years.



CASE STUDY: MICKEY

Male 16 years old. Referred as an emergency.

He tracked down his father at 12 years old to find he had taken his own life. In 2018 his mother had abandoned him and his siblings and moved to another country with her new boyfriend. Throughout the young man's four year stay on and off with BACKUP, he was supported by four services across BACKUP.

His life was chaotic at times, he had drug issues, was in trouble with the police, had physical issues with his liver due to being alcohol dependent and became a dad twice. The young man was supported with doctor appointments, court appearances, probation, appointment with 360, the job centre, counselling, family mediation with his mother, (which was successful), as well as support with budgeting, selfcare, living skills and reducing risks in his life.

He developed into an independent man with a full-time job, more education and the ability to recognise both his triggers and his strengths and how to act on them in an appropriate way. He is now living in his forever home, which he has decorated himself.

PROJECTS & SERVICES AT BACKUP

REDDS PLACE

It is the 12 shared bedsits in a block with a communal dining room, chill out room, on site office and round the clock staff team, 365 days a year. No keys, curfew and no visitors.

LOFT HOUSE

10 self contained flats in a block with on site offices and staff team round the clock; 365 days a year. No keys, curfew and limited visitors.

PROJECT FRONT DOOR

12 units, 10 self contained and 2 shared bedsits with access to communal lounge for leisure and education activities, communal garden and staff on site round the clock. No keys, curfew and limited visitors.

Our role is to enable young people to take control of their decision making, live their best lives, become aware of their rights and choices.

LUCAS PROJECT

28 units of accommodation in 2 blocks; 1 site made up of 6 shared bedsits and 22 self contained. Staff on site round the clock. No curfew, own keys, visitors permitted. Semiindependent.

OUTREACH

36 dispersed flats throughout Bolton. Not connected or in a cluster. Supported through an assertive outreach team. No curfew, residents manage their own keys, front door and visitors.

SUPPORTED LODGINGS

4 units of supported lodgings where a young person lives as a lodger in someone's home as part of the household. We assess, vet, match and risk assess all placements.

CHANCES TEAM

The capacity to support 300 young people a year who are residents at BACKUP, plus another 100 who are not. Specialist support linked to mental health, sexual exploitation and domestic abuse, care leavers and education and employment. The aim being to prevent breakdowns of existing placements at BACKUP and therefore prevent repeat homelessness.

CASE STUDY: MINNIE

Minnie came to the LUCAS project in December 2021.

She had come from a psychiatric hospital in Prestwich and via PFD. When she arrived she was struggling to manage her chaotic mental health which manifested as social anxiety, fear of going out, auditory hallucinations and depression.

Her health journey was long, but was supported by support staff at the LUCAS project and the Chances mental health staff. CAMHS did not provide her with the medication nor the support she felt she needed.

Whilst being supported to attend communal activities, resident's meetings and Chances activities, she built confidence.

At 17, she was estranged from her family but gradually, whilst living here, rebuilt a relationship with her mum. After turning 18 she was able to access more effective mental health services, and she began to develop and improve in all areas.

At the end of summer 2022 she was put on priority and bid on a property in a nearby town which was being built by a housing association. Whilst she waited several months for the property to be ready she was able to move into a fantastic new flat.

She had also started a relationship with another resident who moved out at the same time and the couple got a cat together. M moved out with much better mental health, independence skills and more confidence.

For someone who generally has a bad memory, I can honestly say that I will remember each and every single one of you I have met. I will cherish every conversation provided I wasn't drunk at the time.

I would honestly not be where I am today if it weren't for the support & encouragement you have all given me and in particular my support workers. And I have never till this day said that I am proud of myself for how far I have come and the things I've achieved. This is where once again I give a huge credit to backup for not only providing a roof over my head and Q: How did you find out about Backup?

A. I was kicked out on the streets so my mate took me in and gave me your number which got me a meeting and then I moved into Redds the next day.

preparing me with skills for life, but also giving me a home with the love and support I have been searching for for the first 22 years of my life. There's no place like home they say. But there's also no place like 'backup'. The main thing above all that I'm grateful for is the impact you have all collectively had on me, that eventually brought out the best in me. I sincerely hope I have done you as proud as I've done myself.

Ps: Hopefully this won't be the last you see of me since you've inspired me to come back one day and do what you do for other people.

CASE STUDY: DONALD

He moved into Redds Place in March 2022 following the death of his Mum.

This resulted in the tenancy where they both lived being terminated leaving him homeless. Still grieving, he moved into his own flat within the Outreach Team. He settled into his flat really well and it was very clear he possessed very good independent living skills, his flat was kept in perfect condition. He was able to budget well and had some good cooking skills.

Initialy, D only engaged with his Backup support worker and was isolated in his flat. We referred him to the Chances team for extra support. We also offered face to face counselling through BACKUP. He gradually managed to build up confidence and connections.

He now attends activities twice a week as well as partaking in the recent Service User Panel during the Recruitment of Trainee Support workers and has agreed to become a pioneer member of our upcoming Service User Forum so he can use his experience to make a positive difference at BACKUP. He was nominated and won the "Young Person with Resilience" at the Backup AGM in October 2022.

He is now on priority housing and will be leaving soon to move into his own tenancy with Bolton at Home.



HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

LADIES LUNCH 2022

The Ladies Lunch took place at the Holiday Inn, Bolton. 120 women from Bolton and beyond got together to celebrate BACKUPs Pearl themed lunch in recognition of the 30th anniversary of BACKUPs operations in Bolton. The charity, which supports young people who are homeless, hosts an annual ladies lunch and this year we were entertained by singer John Norcott who hosted the event, had raffles, multiple stalls, and an auction. The charity's CEO Maura Jackson practiced her stand-up comedy routine and had the audience in stitches talking about life, dating and faux pas. The lunch was sponsored by Boo Coaching, KP Financial Wellbeing, Costco, Lisa Forshaw and Cura Accounting. The atmosphere was wonderful and there was a fashion show organised by She Boutique, 2 of the models were young residents of BACKUP, Destiny and Charlie who were amazing. They volunteered to get involved and overcame their nerves to support the event, both were naturals! The event was supported also by colleagues from Lloyds Bank (Hotel Street branch) who are always around to assist the charity's fundraising. We raised a whopping £6k.







TALES OF TRIUMPH

The main feature of the event was a longer film, stories of previous residents who moved on from BACKUP, or Bolton Young Persons Housing Scheme as it used to be called who left the scheme in 1998, 2000, 2006 and up to 2018. MANAGEMENT TEAM RESTRUCTURE

We have developed a new team structure and recruited 2 new Directors. We created 2 new senior manager posts. This has enabled us to recruit from within and promote existing colleagues into permanent management and senior management roles. 3 of the people promoted are also ex service users of BACKUP; now strong features of the leadership team. We are ready to deliver the new Business Strategy for 2023-2027 as a team.

THE VAN

The Van is BACKUPs' social enterprise. A mobile coffee and cake van, which is available to anyone to hire for private and corporate or community events, which will do 3 things.

1. Make a profit (eventually) and create a stream of unrestricted funding to the overall charity.

2. Provide volunteering opportunities for anyone wanting to build confidence or skills in a customer facing role, being a barista and more. This will include current and ex BACKUP residents.

3. Raise awareness of our organisation; tackling and preventing homelessness.

Coffee that counts!

It is not just about money though, the way it operates, it offers volunteering opportunities to young people living in the BACKUP services to develop skills for future employment. Anyone can volunteer though but it is a bonus that we can offer this facility to young people we are supporting.

We train residents on our projects and volunteers to come out in the Van; providing a service to events and locations in Bolton and the North West. What's more, the Van uses products from local, Bolton-based suppliers which means we are spending our business pounds in Bolton. We are working with businesses close to home, to create homes, for young people.

All our coffees and equipment supplier is Rijo42 who provide amazing quality drinks. They have offered lots of additional support and products to get this venture off to a great start. We will also sell and are supported by Vimto. The cakes we sell are fresh, homemade from 2 bespoke local Bolton based cake makers.



We will also operate from local venues trading independently for example train stations or football/ sporting venues. You may have seen us at the Park Run, Food Festival, Community Events and more. 


FINANCES

CASE STUDY: DAISY

ANNUAL TURNOVER



17 year old girl came to BACKUP in 2022.

Since the age of 10 she had lived in three different towns with either family, foster carers or in a childrens home due to relationship breakdowns. D suffered mental health issues such as depression, low mood and anxiety and was also subject to sexual assault, suffers flashbacks and has been vulnerable to exploitation from others. She did a lot of good work with the support of staff but her first placement at Backup didn't work out so we transferred her to an alternative project.

At Loft House she was quiet and lacked confidence. We supported her to manage her previous volatile relationship with her Mum. She was great with money and bills already and can cook! Her confidence has)

grown. She recently turned 18 years old whilst at Loft House, in which she enjoyed a beautiful cake and celebrations with her Mum and siblings. D states her relationship with Mum as improved so much so they recently went on holiday together.

She has told us that her mental health has massively improved. Her maturity, resilience, assertiveness and confidence has grown leading to her recent venture of becoming a flight attendant; she applied to EasyJet without any staff support and got through both interview stages to get a traineeship with the flight company, starting May 2023, London Gatwick. She said she is apprehensive about this move but is confident this is where her future lies.

- 4. Heather Small, The voice of M People headlined at our Gala Ball.
- **5.** Miranda Hart and Heather Small featured in our celebratory music video; Moving On UP.
- 6. We produced a feature film; Tales of Triumph, screened at the AGM in front of 150 guests.

- 7. We had a sell out ladies lunch as well as other charity fundraising events.
- 8. We recruited 2 new Directors.
- 9. We accommodated 168 new young people.
- **10.** A young resident Amina shadowed me for the day to find out more about the role of the CEO.
- **11.** I watched 2 colleagues giving evidence in the Coroners Court after the death of one of our clients, they were so brave.
- 12. A colleague shoulder charged a bathroom door open to intervene in a young persons suicide attempt and saved them.
- **13.** We bypassed our own referral procedures twice to stop someone from rough sleeping and get them off the streets (parks).
- 14. Our colleagues started to check kettles during void inspections after someone pooped in theirs as a leaving gift.

There is so much more..... but as you can see from these few examples my colleagues are an amazing and resilient bunch! The next year for us will be about being tender ready and securing another BMBC contract to deliver excellent services to young people. We will also be reassessed for Investors in People GOLD in October 2023. It also will be the start of our new 2 year Business Strategy; with the vision and mission focused on ending youth homelessness. Everything we do is with young people at the heart and that will never change.

I am still cooking up ideas for the next crazy ideas I can implement to raise money, awareness and support for Backup North West in 2023/24.


